The first night shoot of the season had 8 Shooters, second night shoot we had 9 shooters.

S&T's PROPOSES AN AMBITIOUS SPRING PROGRAM OF IMPROVEMENTS

Gifford Perry and John Mackesy, S&T's co-chairmen presented to the Club's E-Board on Monday, February 12 an ambitious Spring program of improvements to S&T's equipment, facilities and operations, the following was approved:

1. Installation of a new enclosure on the Maynard side Trap range to provide protection for shooters from rain, snow and other adverse weather conditions was approved and ordered and due in this month of April.

2. New wireless callers for Maynard Trap was approved and Gifford and John has installed the new wireless callers March 31st. Callers are now in the storage container. Power switch to operate the callers are in the Trap house. Make sure it's turned on for shooting and OFF when done shooting. There is a also a green hand held controller also that has to be on for the wireless to operate. After 2 minutes it times out if not in use.

3. Extensive renovations and upgrades to the Shooter's Den to make it more modern and clean and welcoming including and upgrading the old and tired kitchen with new cabinets, counter top and sink/faucet, and a fresh coat of paint everywhere was not

approved due other building requests. However new gun rack built by master craftsman Gifford Perry is now installed and hoping to get funds for some painting and kitchen faucet to get replaced. A new flat screen TV was donated by a member and has been installed, and the old skeet machines now have a new home and will be moved out soon.

4. Prepaid Coupons for Clay's Fees. Coupons sold at discounted prices for bulk advance purchases will be offered in lieu of paying cash for clay's fees. Not only will the discounted coupons be a good deal for S&T's shooters, but they will make it more convenient for members to pay for their rounds and ease S&T's administrative burden of collecting, accounting for and depositing cash fees. The new coupons will not have any expiration date and will be accepted for any of the clay shooting sports (Skeet, Trap and 5-Stand) on both the Maynard and the Sudbury sides.

April 21 & 22 is Spring cleanup day all ranges are closed. Gifford has a long list of items needing help so all come out and help. See list at the Shooters Den and if you can put your name down to help would be great.

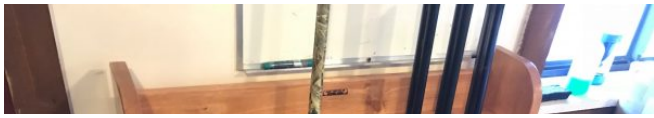
Wireless:
